— HEBREWS 13:8 (NKJV) —

Life is always changing. Circumstances around us are always changing. How do we know Christ in the midst of change? Have you ever been so overwhelmed in the changes of your life that you became lost and confused? We can trust that in the midst of change, Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever.

There have been many changes in technology over the years. When I was in high school I had a pager and a quarter to make phone calls. Nowadays it seems as though even elementary school children have cell phones. According to Popular Mechanics, technology will change even more drastically in the future. Some scientists say that we will have technology that will be able to predict traffic jams, bridges that repair themselves with self-healing concrete, and 3D printers that can print car parts, birthday cakes and Rolexes. We will have self-cleaning clothes and 60 years from now texts from cell phones will be zapped directly into our brains. Some of these might seem far-fetched, but we know technology does not stay the same and is always changing. Thankfully we have a God that will never change even in this ever changing world.

In Hebrews 13:8, the author is talking to Jewish Christians and telling them not to swerve away to strange and different teachings. The author was telling them that the Jesus they knew yesterday is the same today and the same for eternity; and for them to stand firm in Christ the Rock no matter what change happens in this world.

Catalysts for Change

According to the latest report from the Toronto Police, 146 hate or bias crimes were reported in 2014, up from 131 incidents in 2013. 44 of these cases were against Jewish people, 27 against LGBT (Lesbians, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender) people, 20 against Blacks and 16 against Muslims. A hate crime is one in which hate is the motive and can involve intimidation, harassment, physical force or threat of physical force against a person, a group or a property. The Criminal Code of Canada says a hate crime is committed to intimidate, harm or terrify not only a person, but an entire group of people to which the victim belongs. The victims are targeted for who they are, not because of anything they have done. Statistics Canada has begun recording hate crimes in the country, since 2006. Since then the number of incidents continue to rise. What's more to worry about is that, not all the hate crimes committed within a given time and vicinity are being reported or accounted for. The latest reported hate crime victim was a 30-year-old Muslim woman who was violently assaulted outside a Toronto elementary school - an incident that took place in November 16, 2015.

Some brothers and sisters out there are beginning to question themselves, "are we in the end times yet?" My answer to that is, I'm sure I don't know!" or "God only knows!" But what we can be sure of is that we are living in a world that is full of hate and whose master has been locked in in the darkest and deepest pit of the earth for so many years. Now his hateful cronies are on the rise and propagating at an alarming rate.

Hate, according to the dictionary is a passionate feeling of dislike on someone or something. To our knowledge as Christians, hate is the intense dislike felt against Jesus the Messiah by the same people that He dearly loves. Hate is the heavy jagged edged instrument of the enemy that they too had Him carry upon His back, nailed his hands and feet and, crowned him with. Hate is the venom that they gave Him to drink when He said "I thirst". Hate is the strength of the enemy's army that Jesus conquered on that tree for our sake. Jesus did His part. He changed the world with what He did. Now, with Him leading

the way and even reassuring us already of the victory, He calls us to do the same in waging war against the enemy...to make a difference in this hateful world. This is the perfect place and perfect time where and when we must do our part - to defend our faith in Christ - to be the catalyst for change, here and now.

To hate someone because of his or her race, religious background, or other qualities is wrong. You can do something to stop violence and prejudice. You can work to change attitudes. Given the facts and figures above, here are some ideas that we can prayerfully contribute to make our once-peaceful community become livable and peaceful:

- Whatever change you wanted to see in relation to hatred, begin by setting yourself as a good example by showing respect for others through actions, attitudes, and remarks.
- Organize forums to examine possible sources of bigotry and hate violence in the community and brainstorm preventive actions.
- Encourage law enforcement to collect hate crime statistics and make them available to the public.
- Raise public awareness that bias-motivated incidents are crimes and should be reported to the police
- After getting approval from the investigating law enforcement agency, immediately clean up any bias-motivated graffiti. Paint a mural celebrating diversity in its place.
- Work with schools, businesses, or community groups to sponsor poster or essay contests on "How Bias-related Crimes Hurt Our Community."
- Offer support to a co-worker or neighbor who has been a victim of a bias-motivated crime.

Young People Can ...

- Start a conflict resolution program in their school.
- Reject all stereotypes.
- Report incidents of discrimination or hate crimes to parents and teachers.
- Start a peer education program - to teach bias awareness to younger children.
- Organize a community-wide Day of Respect or Day of Dialog, in which all members in your community can share strategies to prevent hate crime.
- Mentor a younger child. Use their creative talents-sing, -write, or paint to share positive anti-violence messages.
- Advocate violence prevention by writing to their local government representative and sharing their ideas.
- Offer support to a classmate who has been a victim of a bias-motivated crime.

Below are some guiding principles that we can meditate on and apply:

Change in a Biblical sense means renewal from a life that no longer conforms to the ways of the world to one that pleases God. For us to see change, we must first be willing to see ourselves as we really are and commit to see God as He really is.

“God is not man, one given to lies, and not a son of man changing His mind. Does He speak and not do what He says? Does He promise and not come through?”

— NUMBERS 23:19 —

We accomplish by the renewing of our minds, an inward spiritual transformation that will manifest itself in outward actions. The Bible presents the transformed life in Christ as demonstrated through our “bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God. Transformation involves those who were once far from God being drawn near to Him through the blood of Christ.

The proof of change within us is seen in the way we increasingly reflect the likeness and glory of Christ. Like what the apostle Paul tells us, “...if God Himself has taken up residence in your life, you can hardly be thinking more of yourself than of Him. Anyone, of course, who has not welcomed this invisible but clearly present God, the Spirit of Christ, won’t know what we’re talking about. But for you who welcome Him, in whom He dwells—even though you still experience all the limitations of sin—you yourself experience life on God’s terms. It stands to reason, doesn’t it, that if the alive-and-present God who raised Jesus from the dead moves into your life, He’ll do the same thing in you that He did in Jesus, bringing you alive to Himself? When God lives and breathes in you (and He does, as surely as He did in Jesus), you are delivered from that dead life. With His Spirit living in you, your body will be as alive as Christ’s!” (Romans 8). To be considered as children of God, we must be led by the Spirit of God. And it is through the power of God’s Spirit that Christ lives within us. The transformed life mirrors the attitude of the apostle Paul:

“I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me”

— GALATIANS 2:20 —

Paul said, that the power of renewal comes from one source. “For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God” (1 Corinthians 1:18). In speaking of Jesus, the apostle Peter,

empowered by the Holy Spirit, boldly declared this truth:

“Salvation comes no other way; no other name has been or will be given to us by which we can be saved, only this one”

— ACTS 4:12 —

Changed lives begin with the gospel message of Christ, for in it is the power of God. It is the gospel that brings us salvation: “It’s news I’m most proud to proclaim, this extraordinary Message of God’s powerful plan to rescue everyone who trusts him, starting with Jews and then right on to everyone else! God’s way of putting people right shows up in the acts of faith, confirming what Scripture has said all along: ‘The person in right standing before God by trusting Him really lives.’” (Romans 1:16-17).

Through the gospel message of Christ, we learn:

“to put off your old self, which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires, and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and to put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness”

— EPHESIANS 4:22-24 —

“So don’t you see that we don’t owe this old do-it-yourself life one red cent. There’s nothing in it for us, nothing at all. The best thing to do is give it a decent burial and get on with your new life. God’s Spirit beckons. There are things to do and places to go!”

— ROMANS 8:12-14 —

The apostle Peter provided us specific instructions on how we are to live out our transformed lives just before he died: “So don’t lose a minute in building on what you’ve been given, complementing your basic faith with good character, spiritual understanding, alert discipline, passionate patience, reverent wonder, warm friendliness, and generous love, each dimension fitting into and developing the others. With these qualities active and growing in your lives, no grass will grow under your feet, no day will pass without its reward as you mature in your experience of our Master Jesus. Without these qualities you can’t see what’s right before you, oblivious that your old sinful life has been wiped off the books. So, friends, confirm God’s invitation to you, his choice of you. Don’t put it off; do it now. Do this, and you’ll have your life on a firm footing, the streets paved and the way wide open into the eternal kingdom of our Master and Savior, Jesus Christ.” (2 Peter 1:3-11).

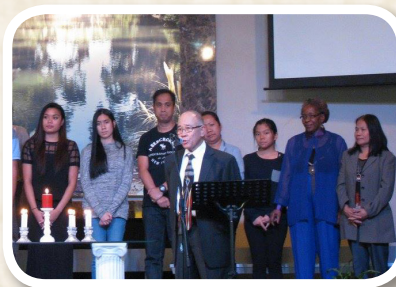


THANKSGIVING SUNDAY **OCT 11**

Missing Stakes: NOT GOD'S MISTAKE

Although I did see God work mightily in and through me over the years, there are still a few times such as now when I am overcome with doubt and feelings of inadequacy. Don't get me wrong -- I believe with all of my heart that God will fulfill every bit of the promises He gave every believer through Scripture. It's just in moments of defeat, of seemingly slow growth, of weakness, and when lies from the enemy get the better of me, that I tend to feel as if I am so far from where God wants me to be and that maybe I am disappointing Him in some way.

Oftentimes in life, we forget that our God is an all-knowing and all-powerful God and that He foreknew all of the things we are going through right now. He knew before we were even conceived all the times that we will fail and fall flat on our faces; times we will rebel and disobey Him; times when we are filled with doubt and fear -- yet He still sent His one and only Son to the cross to die for our sins. He still loves us with an everlasting love and invites us to a relationship with Him.

"But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

STAKING A YOUNG TREE

At this point in my life, I face a different kind of hill in my spiritual journey. As I reflected on what I was going through, it all made sense to me through the analogy of staking a tree:

"When a tree is in the young stages, one of the most vital things you need to provide for it in addition to water and nutrients is support. If you don't hold up the tree somehow, it might end up bending in a certain direction and growing extremely crooked

for the rest of its life... You should only be staking your tree if you think that wind and other forces might be literally moving the ball of roots within the ground. Your staking should prevent all of this movement, because this is the most harmful thing that can happen to a young tree. It causes the roots to be in motion too much and not be able to properly get a hold on the soil so that the tree can develop normally."

It is the adjustment or removal of the stakes that I think I am facing at this moment. The discomfort of it all has been bothering me for quite some time as these were some of the support systems God has placed in my life over the years:

1. Job Certainty

As a new supply teacher, I feel butterflies in my stomach as I wake up each morning -- each day is like the first day of school. The uncertainty of not knowing, where I'll be working, who I will be teaching, or whether or not I will even be working, is a daily dose of bittersweet medicine God is allowing me to have to grow my faith. Gone are the days when I looked at the same sunset at the McDonald's drive thru window, or greet customers at the mall, or ride the exact same bus every morning to my work at the office. Each day, I thrive and survive only by praying, trusting and obeying.

2. Mentors

Although I know that my mentors and former youth leaders are still there for me, it is still a fact that as we all grow older, we move on to the next stages ahead. Gone are the days when I can just come up to one of them on Friday youth night meetings to talk and pray together. Schedules become more complicated, people get married, have kids, move elsewhere and ultimately, it becomes harder to keep in touch.

3. “Barnabas” and “Timothy”

I recently took a break from being a youth leader for various reasons but it wasn't until I left that I realized how important it is to really have “a Paul, a Barnabas, and a Timothy - ones who pull you along, ones who walk alongside you, and ones who you pull along” (Colin Creel, Perspectives). Those young guys and girls I've led and mentored over the years had an immeasurable influence on me -- they kept me accountable to my own growth, inspired me with their passion for God, and they also served as a reminder of how much God has enabled me to mature.

I'm not writing this to excuse myself from having mentors and from discipling because these, I will continue to do no matter what. All I'm saying is that I am at a pivotal moment where I need to stay rooted and keep growing upwards because the adjustment/removal of these “stakes” are necessary and beneficial. I have come to realize that it is up to me now to respond positively in order to become a more mature and fruitful tree.
