

# The Loving Father Heart of God

In the parable that Jesus told about the two lost sons in Luke 15:11-32, I would like to point out three important insights into the loving heart of our heavenly Father. I have adapted these thoughts from the great teaching by Timothy Keller on this parable in the *Gospel in Life* series that a group of us has recently studied at CABC.

### 1 the freeing love of the Father

First of all, we see the freeing love of the Father. Perhaps the saddest part of the story is not the picture of the younger son squandering his life with prostitutes, but when the younger son comes to his father and asks for his inheritance. In effect, the younger son was saying, "Dad, I wish you were dead. Give me your inheritance now so I don't have to wait for you to die." It was a completely selfish way of thinking, and it must have been very painful for the father to experience such callous disregard for his life and love. He had been a good father, and did not deserve such rejection. And yet, in spite of the hurt and rejection, he did not try to manipulate or control his son. He gave him the respect and dignity and autonomy to make his own decisions, and he proceeded to liquidate his property and possessions to make a half of his inheritance available to his younger son. Then he watched and waited anxiously hoping for his son to return.

Is this not our own experience with our heavenly Father? Who among us has not rejected his love, and asked for our inheritance, and chosen to go our own way? And God has never coerced us, or forced us, to do things His way. He gives us the dignity and genuine freedom to make our own choices. He knows that this is the only way to win our true love and devotion, when we give it freely from our hearts. Then he waits patiently and lovingly for us to return to him. In the same way, we need to give our own children the genuine freedom to make their own choices, and then to love and wait and pray for them, and support them through their choices and decisions.

### 2 the initiating love of the Father

Secondly, we see the initiating love of the Father. As soon as the father saw the son from afar, he cast his dignity aside, lifted the hem of his stately robes, and ran to his son, and fell on his neck weeping. He extended grace and forgiveness to his son, and prepared a feast for him. But not only did he initiate his love for his younger son, but also for his elder son. The elder son was just as lost as the younger son. The elder son who stayed was just as alienated from the father as the younger son who left. The elder son was furious that the father wanted to use his part of the inheritance to prepare a feast for the younger son. Both sons were the same at heart – they wanted the father's things, and not the father. But in the same patient and loving way, the father came and initiated love and entreated the elder son to come to the feast.

We need to respond to the initiating love of the Father, and come to the feast of salvation that he has prepared for us, whether we have left for the world, or stayed in religion. We also always need to be initiating our love for our children, and always letting them know how much we love them, and that we are always there for them, whatever the circumstances.

Jesus Christ is our true elder brother, who willingly lay down his life to bring us back into the family of God.

### 3 the sacrificial love of the Father

Thirdly, we see the sacrificial love of the Father. The only way for the Father to welcome back the younger son into the family was at the expense of the elder brother, by using some of his inheritance to make it possible. In the parable that Jesus told, unfortunately, the prodigal did not have a gracious elder brother, but we do. Jesus Christ is our true elder brother, who willingly lay down his life to bring us back into the family of God. He was stripped, and beaten, and cast out, and paid in full the penalty of our disobedience so that we could be restored to an intimate relationship with the Father. Jesus was sent from the Father, to show us the sacrificial love of the Father through the Son, so that we could be welcomed into the family of God. Jesus is our true elder brother who has willingly shared his full inheritance with us so that we can enjoy a new life with our heavenly Father.

As a result of the Father's freeing, initiating and sacrificial love, we need to repent, not just of doing wrong things, but also of the wrong reasons for doing right things. We must repent, not only of our sins of immorality and irreligion, but also of our sins of moral and religious and prideful living. We also need to extend the same kind of freeing, initiating and sacrificial love of the Father to our own children when they choose to go their own way. Regardless of what they may do in life, they need to know that we love them, and that they belong to our family, and that we will be there to do whatever we can to help them in the journey of life.

I trust that these insights into the loving Father heart of our heavenly Father, will be an inspiration and encouragement to us as we struggle through the choices of our own lives, and as we seek to help our children through the struggles of their lives.

#### THE GOSPEL IN LIFE

The Gospel in Life is an eight week video driven discipleship series taught by Pastor Timothy Keller. This study series encourages, challenges, and equips, participating members to integrate and live out their faith more effectively in every area of their lives.

The series includes a DVD teaching time, and a thorough interactive Bible study and discussion time each week. The series topics include: City: The World that Is; Heart: Three Ways to Live; Idolatry: the Sin Beneath the Sin; Community: the Context for Change; Witness: An alternate City; Work: Cultivating the Garden; Justice: A People of Others; Eternity: The World that is to Come.

As a group of about 20 people who have been participating in this series, we have been challenged, and blessed, and stretched, in our understanding of the significance and power of the Gospel, and in the way we live out our faith in our present world. I believe that this series will have a profound and lasting impact on the way we live out our faith in our community, and that it will increase our commitment, compassion and effectiveness to reach out to our world with the life changing message of the Gospel.

### HIS Grace is Sufficient

"Wow that was quite a shock! Somebody was actually listening to me? Praise the Lord, somebody indeed was listening!" That was my initial reaction when I first read the note of my fellow deacon, Mike Borja. However as I dug further into his note, I was rather feeling queasy. He told me that what I shared as a devotional during the deacons' board meeting had really made an impression on him; that he wanted me to put my thoughts down on paper to be published in this quarter's Connect issue. Not only that, he even copy furnished his editor-in-chief, and they even had a deadline! Of course my initial reaction was to explain that I just really read it in a book and that I am afraid to be sued for plagiarism! In my mind, my wife and kids will be thrown out of the house and fend for themselves because we have to hire a lawyer and... you know the drill. Kidding aside, after much prayer and a plea to reconsider, here I am penning this little article and praying that the Holy Spirit will use it to touch more hearts for the glory of God.

A week before the deacons' monthly meeting, I was already trying to decide on what I could share with them. After much prayer, I believed that the Lord led me to the book by C.J. Mahaney, The Cross Centered Life. As I read one of his articles, I suddenly jumped up and paid attention, so to speak, about the creeping danger of legalism in our spiritual lives, which C.J. simply defined as "seeking to achieve forgiveness from God and acceptance by God through obedience to God". I said "yes, this is it! I need to share this with the deacons". I especially like his example of the plate spinner who in the heydays of the variety shows, like the Ed Sullivan show, was one of the attractions. The plate spinner usually was a skilled performer who is able to spin all these plates on thin sticks which are usually taller than him. Generally, he is able to keep them going by sheer agility and skill without any one of the plates dropping to the floor.

C.J. Mahaney compared this story to a brand new Christian:

"Stuart...who after being initially introduced to a plan on reading the whole Bible in a year, proceeded to add meditating on Scripture as one of his spinning plates, then the glories of attending a weekly accountability meeting with the guys from the church was added. His pastor emphasized the importance of church prayer meetings. He then proceeded to attend a conference on evangelism as he needed to be witnessing every day. Then he heard a radio program about fasting and another about personal holiness. Each was good, others were vital; yet without realizing it, Stuart allowed a dangerous shift to take place in his mind and heart. What God had intended to be a means of experiencing grace, he has changed it into a means of earning grace. Instead of being a further expression of his confidence in God's saving work in his life, his spiritual activities became spinning plates to maintain. The shift is plainly seen on Sunday mornings, when a single plate has not wobbled or dropped, Stuart sings and praises God with evident sincerity and zeal however when in a week where several plates fell, he finds it difficult to worship freely. He feels that God disapproves of him, because of his poor performance."

Stuart forgot the one thing that God says should be the most important—the matter of first importance in our life, which is the gospel of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. As Paul said in 1 Corinthians 15:1, 3 "I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you," Paul wrote, "For what I received I passed on to you of first importance: that Christ died for our sins".

As I did to my fellow deacons, I therefore challenge each one, about the emphasis that we place on all the activities of the church which might take away from the Great Commission (Matt. 28:19-20) that the Lord entrusted to us; and about the importance of missions in ensuring that the gospel of our Lord will be, or rather should be, shared by us to the world outside of CABC.

I'm not saying that the above-mentioned activities are not important. In fact, they are vital for our Christian growth and we need to take advantage of them. However, let us not use them as means of earning more grace.
