

### Stepping Out in Faith

We began our ministry at CABC in mid November, 2002. Our years at CABC have been both challenging and rewarding. We are thankful for the many things we have learned; for the opportunities for personal growth; and for the many meaningful relationships that we have enjoyed at CABC. We value and appreciate all of you who have encouraged us, supported us, and showed your love to us over the years.

In the early years it was a challenge to develop the youth ministry, but with the help of a great team of volunteer youth leaders, and with a lot of hard work, prayer, and perseverance, by the grace of God, the youth ministry began to grow. I have had a lot of joy in building relationships with the youth and the youth leaders over the years. I had the privilege of seeing young preteens grow to become young adults. I am proud of them, and thankful for what God continues to do in their lives. I will never forget the impact that they have had on my life.

We are also grateful for the love and support of so many of you in the congregation. We have enjoyed the fellowship in Christ that we have shared with you. You have been a huge and precious part of our lives for more than eleven years, and we will always remember the love that you have shown to us.

It has also been rewarding to have had the opportunity and privilege to study and preach through the book of Hebrews, and now for the last few years to work through the Gospel of John. The Lord has used His Word first and foremost in my own life as I have wrestled with the text to prepare each consecutive message.

And so, how does one discern the leading of the Lord, calling us from one place of ministry to another? Unfortunately, there is no cookie cutter mold that the Lord uses to guide His people – "one size fits all." Each one of us is unique, and the Lord uses unique circumstances and means to reveal His purposes to us. As the hymn writer said, "Some through the

water, some through the flood, some through the fire, but all through the blood...God leads His dear children along."

I believe that the key is that we need to prayerfully seek and be open to what the Lord is saying to us in our circumstances; through the people and experiences that come our way; and through the vision and passions for ministry that He stirs up in our hearts. We need to continually ask questions like, "How can I best use the gifts of time and 'talents' that the Lord has entrusted me for His service?" "What gets me excited as I dream about serving the Lord?" "What opportunities of service is the Lord bringing across my path as I prayerfully and sincerely seek His leading?" These questions and many more are very personal and individual that everyone must answer for him/herself, and no one else can make those decisions for you. Each one must listen to the still small voice of the Lord speaking into one's own heart and circumstances.

Another important verse in seeking the Lord's direction is Ps. 37:4 – "Delight yourself in the Lord, and He will give you the desires of your heart." As we delight in the Lord and seek His will, there may be more than one open door, or possibility of ministry. At that point we must decide which one is best suited, which one gets me most excited, which one would I love to do the most? Whether it is who you will marry, or which school you will attend, or which job you will take, or which ministry you will pursue, you must make a choice, and then commit yourself to serving the Lord in that choice.

"Delight yourself in the Lord, and He will give you the desires of your heart."

As for me personally, over the years at CABC there have been a few issues for which we have sought the Lord's direction and resolution. For several years now, we have sensed a deep longing for a new kind of ministry focus that we can pursue for the remaining years of our ministry, and we sense the Lord opening that door and leading us to step out in faith to experience His amazing provision. It has been with much prayer, and wrestling with the issues, and seeking to discern God's will for us that we have concluded that now is the right time for us to move to a new ministry. With the coming of a new full time youth pastor, my mandate for the youth ministry at CABC has been fulfilled, and with the changing job description and ministry focus at CABC, we believe that now is the time for us to move forward in faith to accept a new ministry call that the Lord has given to us.

Effective March 1, 2014, I have accepted a call to join the ministry at Little Britain Community Baptist Church. I will assume the position of Associate Pastor of Community Life. In His perfect timing, the Lord has opened up a door of ministry where I can focus most of my time on working with the lead pastor, the board, and the congregation to develop activities to reach out into the community; to welcome and nurture those who come to the church; and to help train and equip the people to reach out to their network of relationships for Christ. This focus on evangelism is like the icing on the cake of ministry for me. I am delighted to be able to devote myself to this great ministry that I can work together with others to accomplish.

And so it is with mixed emotions of sadness and anticipation that we step out in faith to follow the Lord into this new ministry endeavor. We will be sad to say farewell to so many good friends at CABC, but we are also excited to give the remaining years of ministry left to us, to focus on community outreach. We will continue to live in Keswick until Michael has graduated from high school, and then we will move to live in the Little Britain area. We trust the Lord to provide a suitable home for us there, as well as teaching opportunities for Michelle in the new school board region. We would appreciate your prayers for us during this time of transition.

We will continue to value our relationships with you, to pray for you, and look forward to hearing news of your progress and developments in the ministry. We hope to continue with many of the friendships that we have formed with individuals and families over the years.

#### Mission: Jesus at Work

Some churches are busy trying to work one program of evangelism after another to see if it is accomplishing its objectives and whether or not it is worth doing. While some just could not decide what mission agency and missionary to support. The strategy we ought to apply is one that has been proven accurate and effective by Jesus, however this is not given the attention it deserves.

We need to examine the record of the New Testament, the Gospels in particular. These were written by eye witnesses' accounts to tell us the truth, primarily to show us that Jesus is truly the Son of God; that He is the perfect example and no one else. We need to read the Bible and give time to trace the stages of Christ as portrayed in the Gospels, and focus on the steps He has taken.

His objective and intention is very clear—to save the world and people for Himself. To build a church of the Spirit so no one should ever perish, but have the everlasting life. To the very end, Jesus gave Himself to bring salvation for all men from all sins.

To Jesus, His mission was world evangelism. He planned to win, He lived, He handpicked the men to disciple, He died and He rose again according to God's heavenly plan. He conceived a plan that did not fail, does not fail and will never fail

### Your Life as an Open Door

In a quiet moment, as I reminisced on those youthful heydays of reckless abandon, fragments of spattered memories sauntered my mind. How, on my first journey of faith searching for greener pastures, I was transported into the unknown; into a new landscape where dreams for a better life can be materialized and genuinely experienced. Such an unimaginable occurrence cannot be realized without the providential act of God.

He orchestrated the whole thing for me to recognize His sovereign control of my destiny as He opens and closes doors.

It dawned on me that when God opens a door, there is always an urgent call for service to be considered. As God's people, we are called to serve. We become His hands and feet to reach out to the lost world to spread the good news of salvation. We are also called to serve one another in the body of believers - the church, whom Christ is the head.

Serving God is not by coercion or obligation, or a wishy-

washy kind of thing to be taken lightly. Our choice for action in serving has to be clear and intentional; motivated by love and our willingness to obey His Majesty, the King of kings. It must be motivated by humility that characterizes a servant attitude; courage to stand adversity; and compassion that resonate to the love of God.

Serving God is costly. Often times, it requires some enduring way of sacrifice to be able to understand the true meaning of costly service. Are we willing to sacrifice our precious time and effort, our resources to serve God and make Him known? Are we willing to pay the cost for whatever it takes? Therefore, a challenge for commitment has to be established with a determined spirit of undivided loyalty. Joshua's words to the Israelites when he challenged them on their willingness to serve, is a challenge for us to think about and consider. "If serving the Lord seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve... But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord"—Joshua 24:15.

Sometimes you may wonder... but unless and until you are willing to allow God to make your life an open door for service to accomplish His purpose, that door is not for you.
